Payments: Full payment at time of booking is required to secure confirmed accommodations. Payment must be received via fax to confirm reservation. Email registration cannot be accepted for your protection regarding internet security. Reservation Payment is due by February 15, 2010. Payment can be made by American Express, Visa, MasterCard or Discover via fax reservation form.

Cancellation & Refunds: For most cruises and tours, a full refund (except for amounts paid for Vacation Protection Plan) will be made for written cancellations received by Cruises Inc. at least 70 days before the date on which you are to commence travel by sea or otherwise. Passengers, who cancel after that date for any reason, including medical or family reasons who decline the Vacation Protection are subject to contracted cancellation fees.

Fees incurred as a result of cancellation cannot be applied to future bookings. Refunds will normally be made to your travel agent. Travel agents may impose their own cancellation fees. Agency fees of any nature are a matter to be decided on solely by the agency and passengers. Name changes require the prior approval of Royal Caribbean and may not always be possible. Cruise and Cruise Tour Contracts are nontransferable. Name changes and departure date changes are considered reservation cancellations and are subject to cancellation fees.

Cruise Rates: Government taxes, fees and gratuities are included in the cruise rate. Vacation protection is also included in the fare. Taxes on airline transportation, air transportation, shore excursions, medical services, items of a personal nature—such as bar beverages, gift shop purchases, beauty salon/ barber shop & massage services, gambling and are not included in the cruise rate.

Liquor Policy: Royal Caribbean is sorry but guests are prohibited from bringing alcoholic beverages of any kind on board the ship for consumption. Alcoholic beverages purchased in the ship's gift shops or in foreign ports will be retained by Royal Caribbean until the end of the voyage. You may purchase mixed drinks and other beverages from any of the ship's bars and lounges. Alcoholic beverages will be not sold or served to anyone under the age of 21. Royal Caribbean reserves the right to refuse the sale of alcoholic beverages to anyone.

Clothing: Casual attire is in order during the day. For one night, a dark suit or formal attire is suggested. The dress code for other evenings ranges from sport coat and tie to casual resort wear.

Passport Data: US Immigration determines the correct documents, which guests must have in their possession in order to travel. Proper travel documentation is required throughout the cruise and is the responsibility of the guest. Any guest traveling without proper documentation will not be allowed to board the vessel and no refund of cruise fare will be issued. Documents must be presented at time of embarkation. All non-US citizens must surrender their passports and/or green cards and these documents will be returned at Immigration upon arrival back in the US. US and Canadian guests need proof of citizenship (Passport). Resident Aliens need both a passport and an Alien Residents Card. Aliens need a valid passport and a valid unexpired US multiple Re-Entry Visa. Aliens eligible to apply under Visa Waiver Program must have a valid unexpired Passport.

Minor Guests: Guests under the age of 21 years must be accompanied by a parent, grandparent, or guardian 25 years or older in the same stateroom. Infants must be at least 4 months old to be eligible to travel. Royal Caribbean offers supervised activities for children 2-15 with limited activities available for 16-18 year olds.

Responsibility: Cruises Inc. neither controls, nor operates, nor is responsible for the actions of independent Contractors such as cruise lines, airlines, railroad companies, tour operators or ground transportation. You are responsible for arriving at the respective ports on time for embarkation and for joining the vessel at its next port of call if for any reason you miss a schedule sailing. Royal Caribbean reserves the right to refuse or discontinue passage to anyone when in Royal Caribbean's judgment; it would be considered a risk to the guest's own safety and well-being or the health, safety, well-being comfort and enjoyment of any other guest or crewmember.
